I would like to wish all of our Mum's a very special day – it is a chance for us to think about the care and nurturing that our Mothers provide and to let our Mum's know how special they are. It is also a day to remember all the women who have played a pivotal role in every generation of our families.

#### Compass School Manager – Parent Workshops

I wrote in the newsletter last year that we were moving to the use of Compass School Manager to streamline student attendance processes, provide access to the school calendar of events for the whole year, approve participation in school events and communicate student progress through an easy to use online parent portal. You, as parents, will be able to log in and access information related to learning progress and school events anywhere at any time. It is a really exciting opportunity for us to be able to connect all of these features in a single parent access portal.

Compass will be live for our parents and guardians from the 7<sup>th</sup> June with our Semester 1 student report cards being distributed through the portal.

To support our parents in moving to the use of Compass, I will be holding parent workshops to guide you through logging in, locating the report cards, entering and approving student absences and checking what the current learning focus for your child is in each area of their learning program.

It is really important that parents who have not used Compass before attend a workshop session. The workshops will run for approximately half an hour and will be held on:

We will send home an RSVP slip for the workshops so that we know how many families to expect at each session. We have scheduled some of the sessions in alignment with the school disco sessions so that you can drop the kids off and attend a workshop session while you are waiting to pick them up.

#### Changes to student report cards and Parent/Teacher Interviews

Our student report cards will be changing to provide targeted teacher feedback for each topic studied in each subject area. The reports will provide more detailed feedback on skills and understandings that have been mastered and guidance around areas for further improvement. Parent/Teacher interviews will be held on Thursday 21st June.

From the beginning of Term 3, this feedback will be available to families at the end of each unit. Student progress information will be available 'live' and in an ongoing way throughout a school term rather than at the end of a semester. These changes are based on our intent to support students setting targeted learning goals and to increase in their ability to actively manage their learning. Feedback from our families also indicates that they would like to be able to support further learning at home.

#### Working Bee

# The importance of Reading Aloud



At our recent Reading Information Night, we spoke about the importance of reading aloud with and to your child even if they are in grade 6.

#### When Parents & Teachers READ ALOUD to children they provide valuable opportunities such as:

It gives our child the experience of what real reading is about

To think about the big ideas of others, of themselves, and the world

It allows our children to access to explore deeply – ideas and information

Allows the children to get INSIDE A BOOK

Your child may be able to understand the words (DECODING) but not the meaning so you are developing and supporting their comprehension understanding.

We free up our children to THINK

To imagine

Reading aloud offers us a chance to be fully present with our children. It also increases our kids' academic success and can inspire compassion.

#### Reading aloud impacts on their independent reading by:

Learning to understand that REAL READERS pause to wonder, to think, to ask questions

Stories can affect us even change us

They see us REACT we help them walk through the shoes of others that may be radically different to themselves

It gives them the opportunity to think of other points of view

It gives everyone the chance to LOOK UP from our phones, TV and screens and connect with each other

Finally they learn to love reading and be a lifelong reader giving them one of the greatest GIFTS of all.

# Making a Difference at Belgrave South Primary School

In 2013 we introduced a program for students who need additional support in reading. The program is called Toe by Toe and is presented in a book that the child uses each day. The child works one-to-one with a 'coach' for 15 minutes per day, 3 days per week.

This program was developed in the UK and has been extensively researched. We have found that the program has assisted our children to make significant progress in only a short time. This progress has also been sustained after the program was finished.

Teachers and Educational Support staff are working with several students across the school this term.

The program can also be taken by non-teachers, so we would like to ask if there are any <u>parents</u>, <u>carers or grandparents</u> willing and able to come up to the school for 15 minutes per day, 2- 4 days a week to support one child in reading. This would be a very rewarding program for both the child and the adult. We'd love the additional assistance in helping those students who need a little extra attention. Currently we have some volunteers from last year who have continued to work with our children this term. However, we need more volunteers to support this worthwhile program.

You don't need special qualifications, only patience and the desire to make a significance difference to young person's life.


