# Curriculum Update...



## Preparing our grade six students for the next stage in their educational journey.

The transition from primary to secondary school is a milestone in educational life, after the familiar surroundings of primary school, the move to secondary school will be both an exciting and perhaps daunting time for both you and your child. At Belgrave South we provide a transition program that supports our grade six students to feel comfortable and supported through this challenging time. Even the keenest student will take some adjusting to their new school's daily routines, the work load and the school's expectations. There are sure to be one or two bumps along the way which may cause some stress.

Part of our transition is providing opportunities for students to express their concerns or with youth leaders from Reach. Reach was established in 1994 by Jim Stynes OAM (AFL Brownlow Medalist, youth motivator, and Victorian of the Year 2003) and Australian film director, Paul Currie. Reach was born from a desire to inspire every young person to believe in themselves and get the most out of life.

Over the year I have had the opportunity to witness our students taking part in a session which aims to assist in the transition from primary to secondary school. The workshops encourage our students to express and overcome fears, build self-confidence and develop personal leadership skills. Our students were engaged in high energy, interactive activities and powerful group discussions.

They moved out of their comfort zone and interacted with other people in a very supportive environment. Thank you to Mrs Price and Mrs Boatto for providing this excellent life learning experience.

Remember your child's secondary school will have year seven coordinators and councilors to support you and your child through transition.

## Excellence Awards




Congratulations to the students who received an Excellence award for term four.
