# From the Principal...

Dear Parents and Carers,

At our most recent assembly, we presented the first of our values based achievement awards. The value in focus was 'Care and Compassion' which is best described as caring for yourself and caring for others. Our citizenship awards are a chance to recognise those students who demonstrate the values that underpin excellence in their learning, their actions and in their relationships each and every day without needing to be prompted or reminded that these key values are a crucial element of our school culture. Our school values provide the framework that encourages students to use their judgement, exercise responsibility in areas of morality, ethics and social justice, to make rational and informed decisions about their own lives and to accept responsibility for their own actions, as intended in the national position on values education in schools. Visiting classrooms, I see strong evidence of students caring for each other during learning time. Going the extra mile to make sure that their learning partners and classmates are recognised and supported when they face the challenge of learning new and difficult things. As a school community, we should be extremely proud of our children.

I congratulate all the students that were recognised at assembly and although I was required to attend a conference on Monday, I very much enjoyed reading the reason for each award while I was printing them last Sunday. The recipients of the awards will now be acknowledged in our fortnightly newsletter.

## **Community Precinct**

I thought it would be helpful to clarify some of the uncertainty that surrounds our kitchen garden project. The intent of the project has always been to create a space that would provide a venue for our school and students as well as local community groups. A venue that we could use to host programs that support learning and events that would help to strengthen our community.

With the support of the Victorian School Building Authority, we have been awarded a \$200,000 grant to help us create the final stage of this project. It means that we are also able to bring to life the many discussions that we have had over the previous twelve months with the former Manager of the Community House and the local Scout Leader about them making use of this space to bring new light and life to the community groups that they lead.

I would like to reassure our community that the local Scouting movement will most certainly have a new home and the venue is able to be used by the community group to host events and workshops.

The Executive Manager of Scouts Victoria, Mr Jon McGregor has shared with me a communication that the local scout leader, Mr Keith Atkin, has circulated amongst their many members and families which reads:

Scouts Victoria has met again recently with Stuart Boyle who is the Principal of Belgrave South Primary. Stuart is a former Venturer and fantastic advocate of Scouting. The Education Department also attended this meeting to discuss the future of our hall.

All parties are committed to building a brand new hall for our group. We have discussed the construction of a new 20x7x3m hall that will be available for Scouting across as many days as required. It will also include a 4x4m dedicated office space for leaders and all of our memorabilia. We have also been told that the new hall will have greater storage than our current situation and plenty of visible signage for the community.

Scouts Professional Facilities Support Team along with myself have been invited to attend planning meetings so that we can be involved in the important design phase of this new hall.

The Education Department has agreed to push out the demolition phase until the end of the year to give us time to think through the logistics of any transition arrangements.

Working closely with the School will bring benefits for all of us and the alignment of our programs with education is important for our future. We are grateful to the School for making space for us in their masterplan so there is a place for scouting in Belgrave South for decades to come.

From here, we are busily working on all the necessary planning required for the construction phase of the new space. We are incredibly excited that our students will be able to be involved in the planning and development of programs of learning for the local community. The opportunity for our students to be part of the process of enriching our community is a very powerful learning experience. I look forward to meeting with members of the community and former Board of Management of the Community House to forge a new chapter.

## **Harrison Scholarship**

I received a phone call last week from Michael Harrison whose grandchildren, Jade and Zane, currently attend Belgrave South. On behalf of his family, Michael has generously offered to establish a scholarship in memory of his parents Jack (John) and Margaret Harrison who lived in Belgrave Heights for over 60 years and were very involved in the community.

They had a long association with Belgrave South Primary School with their five children, six of their grandchildren and currently two of their great grandchildren attending the school.

Michael has told me that they were loving people that led reasonably simple lives with family being their main priority. Jack passed away in December 2016 aged 89 and Margaret passed away at the age of 93 in August 2017.

In honour of Jack and Margaret and on behalf of the Harrison family, Michael has offered to establish a scholarship that will assist a graduating Grade 6 student to pursue their secondary education.

The scholarship will be known as the Jack and Margaret Harrison Scholarship and will provide \$500 to a deserving student each year. As Michael has said, his parents would be delighted to know that they are helping children with their education.

On behalf of our school community, I thank Michael and the Harrison family for their generosity and for supporting our school and students in the pursuit of lifelong learning.

## Curriculum News...

#### WHAT IS SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL LEARNING?

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) is the process through which children and young people acquire the knowledge, attitudes and skills associated with the core areas of social and emotional competency.

Social and emotional learning (SEL) can help students learn the competencies and skills they need to build resilience and effectively manage their emotions, behavior and relationships with others. These are lifelong skills.

According to the Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL) quality teaching of SEL promotes student satisfaction, success and academic engagement, outcomes and achievement.

#### **CASEL identifies 5 Key Social and Emotional Competencies**

Self-Awareness, Self-Management, Social Awareness Relationship Skills and Responsible Decision-making.

The Australian Research Alliance for Children and Youth notes that schools who ensure that SEL is part of their teaching and learning can give students the opportunity to build the resilience to deal with change and unpredictability. This is an essential skill for positive mental health.

#### SEL programs set out to explicitly teach a range of skills, including those necessary to:

- understand and manage emotions
- set and achieve positive goals
- feel and show empathy for others
- establish and maintain positive relationships
- make responsible decisions

These skills are dynamic and inter-related and underpin both personal resilience and healthy relationships.

At Belgrave South we explicitly teach SEL in all class rooms on a regular basis and have implemented classroom programs and Professional Development that focus on Social and Emotion competencies.

Our Curriculum Day on Friday (July 27<sup>th</sup>) was the continuation around the Berry Street Educational Model which builds staff capacity in teaching Social and Emotional competencies and Trauma Base practice.

This week our focus for our Achievement Awards is 'Care & Compassion', which supports developing Social Awareness in our children.

# The Journey Begins.....





Research has shown the more opportunities a child has to interact and visit their new school environment before they start school the more likely it is that the initial transition into school will be successful. Parents/caregivers will then feel more comfortable about their choice of school.

Belgrave South Primary School acknowledges the importance of transition for our children and their families. We have developed an intensive transition program that caters for our new Foundation students and their parents/caregivers.

As part of our Transition program, last Wednesday evening Dr Kay Margetts was our guest speaker on School Readiness.

Kay is an Associate Professor at Melbourne University in Early Childhood and Primary Education. Kay focused on School Readiness and the skills required for a smooth transition into school. The feedback from the parents who were able to attend was very favorable and supportive.

On Friday Afternoon as part of our Preschool to Foundation Transition our preschool children spent time in the Foundation classrooms and with the specialist music teacher. While the parents and caregivers had an opportunity to meet with Stuart, our principal and Carol, our assistant principal for afternoon tea.

The next transition session is on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> August where the children will have a session with Mr Anderson for PE and a session with Mrs Williams in the Art room.




